

Relationship Summary

Alamo Advisors, LP (referred to as "we" or "us") is registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) as an investment adviser. We feel that it is important for you, the *retail investor*, to understand how advisory and brokerage services and fees differ in order to determine which type of account is right for you. There are free and simple tools available to research firms and financial professionals at Investor.gov/CRS, which also provides educational materials about broker-dealers, investment advisers, and investing.

What investment services and advice can you provide me?

Our firm offers investment advisory services to *retail investors*. If you open an advisory account with our firm, we'll meet with you to understand your current financial situation, existing resources, goals and risk tolerance. Based on what we learn, we will (i) prepare an Investment Policy Statement reflecting your circumstances, (ii) assist you in choosing an investment strategy and appropriate portfolio; (iii) assist you in the search for and selection of mutual funds and, if appropriate, third-party asset managers. As part of our standard services, we provide continuous monitoring of client accounts. Our accounts are managed on a non-discretionary basis which means you are required to preapprove each investment transaction that we recommend for you. We limit the types of investments that are recommended since not every type of investment vehicle is needed to create an appropriate portfolio. We primarily recommend stocks, bonds, and mutual funds.

What fees will I pay?

We require a minimum account size of \$5 million, which may be negotiable under certain circumstances. We charge an ongoing quarterly fee for investment advisory services, which is a percentage of the value of your account. You pay this fee even if you don't buy or sell investments. In certain cases, we may recommend third-party asset managers who will assist us with managing your account. A third-party asset manager's fee is separate from our fee and will be described to you in a separate and formal agreement between you and the third-party asset manager. Also, if you engage us for any non-advisory tax consulting or tax compliance work, we may charge an additional hourly rate or adjust our advisory fee to include those services. Certain tax services may be provided without a fee adjustment.

Other Fees and Costs

In addition to the quarterly fee, you may also incur charges for management and operating expenses of open-end, closed-end and exchange-traded funds; short-term trading charges of certain mutual funds; wire transfer fees; and interest charges on margin loans. You will also pay the custodian of your assets a fee. We do not receive any portion of these fees.

Additional Information

The fee you pay us may be higher or lower than what other advisers charge for similar services. You will pay fees and costs whether you make or lose money on your investments. Fees and costs will reduce any amount of money you make on your investments over time. Please make sure you understand what fees and costs you are paying.

What are your legal obligations to me when acting as my investment adviser? How else does your firm make money and what conflicts of interest do you have?

We are fiduciaries. When we act as your investment adviser, we have to act in your best interest and not put our interest ahead of yours. At the same time, the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests. You should understand and ask us about these conflicts because they can affect the investment advice we provide you. Here are some examples to help you understand what this means:

- We have a conflict of interest because the more assets you have in your advisory account, the more you will pay us and thus we have an incentive to increase those assets in order to increase our revenue.
- 2. We have a conflict if we recommend that you roll over your retirement plan assets into an account to be managed by us since we will earn an advisory fee on the rolled over assets.
- 3. We have a conflict if we recommend additional tax consulting or tax compliance services to you because, in most cases, we will earn an additional fee for providing those services.

We have systems in place to mitigate conflicts of interest, including systems to review whether a recommendation is in your best interest. Alamo Advisors, LP is an independent fee-based investment adviser. Our firm is not a broker-dealer and none of our financial professionals are representatives of a broker-dealer. Therefore, we do not provide brokerage services and do not receive any commissions or compensation from any investment product vendors.
